Gorongosa National Park in Mozambique, Africa - \$200,000 (4 projects, \$50,000 each)

- Anti-Poaching Unit- Supports 120 passionate scouts dedicated to stopping poaching throughout Gorongosa National Park.
- Elephants- Prevents human-elephant conflict including: poaching for ivory, monitoring of herds, and working with local communities on a long-term plan.
- Ecohealth Program- Focuses on improving food security, empowering women, and increasing access to essential health services to the communities around Gorongosa Park.
- Vulnerable Children Education- Aims to empower young people living around Gorongosa National Park to exercise new professions and to develop their own productive and commercial activities instead of illegal ones that exploit the natural resources of the park.

In 2013, Zoo Boise and Gorongosa National Park in Mozambique formed a long-term restoration partnership. Gorongosa National Park is one of the most biodiverse places on the planet and Zoo Boise is helping to protect the many incredible species that call the park home.

Zoo Boise worked with Dr. Eric Yensen, a retired College of Idaho professor, to develop a protocol for successfully reintroducing Southern Idaho ground squirrels into the wild. Zoo Boise housed Southern Idaho ground squirrels as a breeding population to reintroduce into the wild. The project involved setting up specially designed release pens and monitoring the squirrels for survival and breeding rates through following years.
