


Multiple Classes?


Book your private guided program led by zoo education staff.

Guided Tour & Zoo Admission

- Biofact Exploration
 - Skulls, feathers, feet, beaks, and pelts (this is the only time we will encourage you to "touch a lion").
- Hands-on STEM focused activities
- Ambassador animal meet & greet (animal availability subject to change depending on the needs of the animal) – add'l \$25 per group

Visit with your class or whole grade and we will take care of the science!





PRICING & GROUP INFO

Cost = Guided Program + Zoo Admission

- \$12 per student
- \$6 per staff & chaperones*
- \$6 per student if a Zoo Boise member

This price is available to public schools and registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations that provide services to youth and communities in Idaho.

Group Size

- Minimum is 15 people, maximum is 30 people in one time slot.
- Guided groups require one chaperone for every five students.
- To arrange back-to-back or concurrent programs for larger groups, include details in the <u>online form for scheduling</u>.
 - We will contact you to arrange logistics specific to your group's needs.
- *Discounted staff and chaperone pricing covers up to 6 adults;
 additional adults will be charge the \$12 participant rate

CHAPERONE INFORMATION

PAYMENT

Is your school or organization paying for Adult Chaperones?

- If yes, include with your payment at time of arrival.
- If no, advise them in advance they are to pay separately upon arrival.*

 *They will be charged the general admission rate.

ARRIVAL & PARKING

Chaperones will be directed by zoo staff to wait in Julia Davis Park until your school arrives – not in front of the zoo.

- Parking passes available for visits over two hours.
- Pay at front gate if school is not paying for their entry.


ETIQUETTE

Guided groups require one chaperone for every ten students, 1:10 ratio.

- Teachers: assign groups before arriving at the zoo.
- Chaperones are expected to guide and manage students and demonstrate appropriate behavior while in the zoo.
- Review Zoo Etiquette page and Zoo Etiquette video with your students.

ENTRY/EXIT

- Discuss lunch plans, departing times, and meeting location with chaperones, students, and bus drivers.
- Choose a meeting area in Julia Davis Park; do NOT meet in front of the zoo
- Zoo Boise will not make any announcements to gather your group.
- All groups must exit through the exit by the gift shop, NOT the Front Gate.
- Chaperones may get a stamp for re-entry either for themselves or for their assigned group.






Bus: Follow Bus Route Map & Parking Do NOT drop off at front of the Zoo!!!

Teacher: Line up your classes & remind them of zoo etiquette.



ZOO ETIQUETTE

DO...





Respect all zoo animals, staff, and property!

Watch this video with your students before your field trip day.



DO NOT...

Do NOT tap on the glass!

Do NOT throw objects (including food, plants, or coins) into animal habitats.

Do NOT feed, chase, or touch free roaming animals (ducks, geese, squirrels, etc.)

If you do not follow these guidelines, your group will be asked to leave Zoo Boise.



Have you been teaching adaptations, life cycles, or habitats?

Explore the zoo with us and learn how we meet the needs of the animals under our care, stories about our individual animals (how did our crocodile Pandora get her name?), and how you can bring conservation back to your school.
